 - a. This committee, comprised of selected representatives of NLCERA EMS System, is committed to proactive facilitation and continual improvement of outcome oriented, patient centered, pre-hospital emergency care for citizens in the NLCERA

 - a. Vivian was our citizen member of the NLCERA EMS Advisory Committee and she will be missed.
- 5) PFA Updates
 - a. NLCERA EMS Response Compliance
 - i. First Quarter 2019 Data overview
 - 1. Bill provided a brief overview of the first quarter 2019 data.
 - a. Zone 1 non-emergent and Zone 2 emergent are the main issue areas regarding maximum time exceptions.
 - b. Data is stable regarding response
 - c. Many changes in the works within response toward improvements.
 - ii. Remediation-Equivalency (R-E) program update
 - 1. March R-E Overview
 - 2. With Aaron Leonard now working as the UCHealth EMS Contract data manager, the R-E's are focusing on the areas of improvement as required.
 - b. 2019-2020 EMS Contract Renewal Update
 - i. PFA has renewed the EMS Contract with UCHealth effective May 31, 2019 June 1, 2020.
 - 1. Amendment #5 brings the new NLCERA Map, and a rewrite of unusual factors paragraph, compliance measurement criteria for zone 5, and removal of overload within the contract.

c. NLCERA Protocols update

- i. Kevin gave an overview of the content changes to the next protocol update. This release should be very clear to all certification levels specifically, who can perform what action or administer what medication.
- ii. The PDF version of this release will be completely hyperlinked throughout the document.
- iii. The protocols will be updated on the PPP app, as well as on the EMS and NLCERA pages of the Poudre-Fire.org website.
- iv. Kevin hopes to have the protocols released in the next three weeks.

6) UCHealth Updates

- a. Staffing and deployment updates
 - i. UCHealth EMS has a process in place to hire a QA person, many applicants.
- 7) Focused discussions on Challenges and Opportunities regarding:
 - a. Communications
 - i. FirstNet conference call update
 - 1. Bill provided a brief overview of the phone call with Tony from Colorado State Gov. regarding First Net.
 - a. Basically, go with the carrier you have the best service from because they all will be providing priority service to first responders.
 - b. Call Bill if anyone has questions regarding First Net.
 - ii. Air Ops updates
 - 1. Duane provided a map list of previous responses within the NLCERA. This was follow-up from last meeting and much appreciated.
 - iii. Dispatch Centers FC and LC
 - 1. This week is National Dispatchers Week.
 - 2. FC is down one position (interviews next month) and is well staffed.
 - 3. Carol is back as Dispatch Center Manager
 - 4. Rena Martinez is the Director
 - iv. New CAD is coming March of 2020 County wide system
 - 1. Five more meetings with Tritech
 - 2. Training will be early in 2020
 - 3. Kevin: Increased capability to seamlessly dispatch the closest unit regardless of jurisdictional boundaries. Operations agreements being formed now.
 - v. LCSO Paging update
 - 1. Justin: Hiplink issues are mostly corrected. Steve Bebell will be reaching out soon to departments involved.
 - a. This will replace web paging
 - b. This has significant messaging capabilities within CAD.
 - vi. OEM (LC and FC)
 - 1. Lori Hodges (LC):

- a. The County is establishing a "Special Needs Database" (SND) for people with special needs who may need assistance in disaster or emergency evacuations.
 - i. All will be entered into Everbridge for communication.
 - ii. Can be sorted by type.
 - iii. Can be used to provide information to IC's from EOC
 - iv. Sign up at LETA911.org
 - v. People are still responsible to evacuate at earliest notification
 - vi. A SND protocol for use is being developed.
 - vii. The SND is updated monthly
- b. Flood plain maps are being digitized for better use during emergency events.
 - i. Better prediction of where will flood
 - ii. Emergency action plans for specific areas
 - iii. Will be in secure location on web.
- c. Larimer County has purchased Salamander tagging system
 - i. Will be utilized for credentialing on large incidents
- d. Mapping tool program purchased to help predict effects of infrastructure failures.
- e. Full scale exercise is June 5th
 - i. Two sites and five hospitals
 - ii. Contact Lori if interested or wish to volunteer
- f. With City of Ft Collins having OEM from PFA, Larimer County OEM covers areas outside the city which are in the county.
- 2. Chris Wolf (FC):
 - a. Office of Emergency Management is now under the City of Fort Collins.
 - i. Four finalists for director position
 - ii. Next week will be a "meet and greet" with candidates
 - iii. Goal is to have selected new director by June 1, 2019
 - b. Full Scale Exercise City conducting employee table-top to work on effects.
 - i. Need a logistics person Contact Chris if interested.
- vii. ReadyOP test
 - 1. No ReadyOp test sent prior to the meeting a test will be sent next meeting in June.
 - 2. Remember to update contact information.
 - a. Bill still working on update form for the NLCERA
- viii. 800 Meg or VHF issues?

- 1. Carol D. described an issue of not being in contact with an air resource that landed on the road without ground contact
 - a. Much discussion about StacD being direct line of site for ground contact personnel strengths and weaknesses
 - b. Consensus is IC is responsible to setup communication for incoming air resources.
 - i. Use PSAPs to coordinate if necessary
 - c. Suggestion to bring up at the Larimer County Fire Chiefs Association meeting to standardize the use of StacD for ground contact.
