# Quarterly Rural Fire Chiefs Meeting – Minutes August 18, 2018

PFA Administering the NLCERA EMS Contract with UCH by representing Rural NLCERA EMS Fire Departments/Districts through IGAs

Greetings NLCERA EMS Rural Fire Chiefs and designees,

Please see the minutes from the third quarter August 18, 2018 meeting. The meeting was held at Orville's Restaurant, 08:30 - 10:00.

    - i. Changes in leadership, roles or governance relating to EMS?
      - 1. WFPD New Battalion Chief update
        - a. WFPD now has two BC's Justin Rupert is recent BC hired
      - 2. UCH220 is now WFPD designated ambulance
        - a. No issues
    - ii. ReadyOp testing, use and contact information changes?
      - 1. Bill apologized for combining the NLCERA EMS Advisory Committee and the NLCERA EMS Rural Chief's meetings this week into one ReadyOp notification on Wednesday.
      - 2. A separate ReadyOp notification will be sent before each meeting.
  - b. PFA Updates
    - i. Chief Waters shared with everyone the recent staffing additions to PFA's EMS Division:
      - 1. Floyd Salazar is PFA's fulltime EMS Captain

- 2. Capt. Estaban Guzman is PFA's first (3yr) rotational EMS Captain
- 3. Amy Maddox is now part of the EMS Division and will be the point of contact for PFA certs and continuing education.
  - a. Amy can provide assistance to the Rural NLCERA if needed.
  - b. LCES and LC Parks are involved in PFA provided trainings and PFA is supporting their cert maintenance.
- 4. Continuity of Patient care is the goal from additional staffing and collaboration.
- 5. EMR discussion
  - a. NOLS certifications may transfer at some point as EMR
  - Kevin CDPHE is now responsible for EMR certifications. More information about EMR as it becomes available.
    - i. EMR, EMT, EMT-A Training in Colorado
    - ii. Mark will the protocols have EMR included?
      - 1. Kevin, yes EMR will be within the new protocols.
    - iii. Question if A-EMT is still a cert?
      - 1. Per Kevin it still is a cert.
      - 2. EMT-A is progression from EMT
- ii. NLCERA Peer Support Team Discussion
  - 1. Peer Support Academy Report
    - a. Both Bill and Kevin attended the Emergency Responder Trauma Counselors (ERTC) - Peer Support Academy in July.
    - b. PFA has developed a proposed NLCERA Rural VFD Peer Support Team guiding document to possibly be adopted by each NLCERA Rural Fire Department when considering joining the NLCERA Rural VFD Peer Support Team.
- iii. First Watch Online Compliance Utility (FW-OCU) PFA data update
  - 1. The FW OCU is live and data will be presented in the future meetings.
- iv. Ambulance response to Zones 2-5 CAD updated
  - 1. The second quarter data was being compared by the two compliance programs and will be presented at the fourth quarter meeting.
  - 2. The posting locations were changed to login and move within the NLCERA fire districts, and for PFA within their station areas. This allows this version of CAD to better identify the most appropriate ambulance recommendation for response.
  - 3. For responses in the rural NLCERA mountain areas, any available ambulance will be moved to Livermore fire district to

- ensure they are recommended first if another EMS response is required during their return to Fort Collins.
- 4. Anecdotal discussion that it seems the ambulances are arriving quicker by the rural NLCERA.
- v. PFA/UCH/Dispatch new standing committee to improve planning and coordination
  - 1. Chief Waters and Reina Martinez initiated this committee
  - 2. This committee is to augment CRISP Admin and CRISP Steering which are administrative and technical. Where this committee will focus on the strategic operational aspects of the many changes and opportunities we all seek to coordinate.
  - 3. Discussion: The advantages of how this new strategic committee may ensure strategic level end-user items are being accounted for. An example is the Mutual Aid radio channels now being installed on the air resources for better response communications, and the new CAD system.
- c. UCHealth updates
  - i. Organizational Updates
    - 1. Organizational structure update
      - a. Andrew Battles UCH Senior Director of Emergency Services
        - i. Andrew Battles was introduced as the new Senior Director of EMS at UCH
        - ii. Andrew gave a brief overview of his roles and experience. We all welcome Andrew's efforts to help improve EMS response in the NLCERA.
      - b. New UCH EMS Director search update
        - Tim Seidel will be joining UCH as of August 27, 2018 as the new Director of EMS – UCH Ambulance
      - c. Education and QA:
        - i. Rob Collett is now the UCH education coordinator
        - ii. Nick Nolen is now the UCH QA coordinator
      - d. Mark R. Requested an organizational chart from UCH.
        - i. Nick to follow-up with chart to all.
    - 2. Unit ID updates
      - a. All UCH units are within 200 series ID, with WFPD ambulance being UCH 220.
        - i. Rural NLCERA may see any ambulance due to new dynamic postings.

### ii. No issues from the group.

- a. In process, no timeline
- 4. Rendezvous Reimbursements progress
  - a. Nick Reimbursement process should be setup soon once UCH legal ensures process does not violate or present as pay for patients.
  - b. All rural NLCERA departments please continue to keep transport and transfer of patients to UCH records for reimbursement.
- 5. UCH Ambulance Posting Updates
  - a. Zones 2-5
  - b. Review UCH units logging into fire response districts or station areas for better CAD recommendation.
  - c. If in rural NLCERA the returning ambulance, if available, will be moved to Livermore Fire to ensure recommendation back up County Rd. 74E.

# ii. ESO update

- 1. ESO is expected to provide a better means for follow-up information to NLCERA departments, as well as drive future training.
- 2. Still HIPPA constraints being worked through to provide feedback to responding departments.
  - a. Mark the system for feedback is not working at this time and needs to be as a learning tool.
  - b. Use NLCERA Feedback form to track requests for information follow-up.
  - c. Kevin advised PFA is not able to receive follow-up at this time but will ensure this is worked out as soon as possible.
  - d. Livermore is receiving quarterly follow-up reports, so possibly there are multiple interpretations?
  - e. Nick large fines for releasing information as a HIPPA violation.

## iii. Status regarding redesign of patient care forms

- 1. Many departments need new NLCERA patient care forms.
- 2. Kevin to check on what PFA has available as patient care forms to offer the NLCERA departments since PFA is moving to tablets in one week.
- iv. 2018 NLCERA and WFPD Annual Report Due September 1, 2018 d. NLCERA 2018 Data:
  - i. Third Quarter Data reviewed briefly, and with First Watch Online Compliance Utility (FW OCU) live we will have improved metrics to visualize the data in real time. More updates will be presented at the 2018 fourth quarter meeting.

      - 1. Needs for 800 Meg radios
        - a. CLFPD needs 15 radios
        - b. RFL needs 4

        - a. PFA to verify what air resources have and update at Fourth Quarter meeting. (MA 1, 2, and 3 are being installed)
      - 3. Problem: Lifeline offers subscriptions for air evacuation in the NLCERA. If another air resource is called and not that copter, there have been issues of cost. Can they all be under the same umbrella?
        - a. After much discussion, the exigent nature of needing an air resource, this is a difficult situation and should be researched further by each NLCERA department.
        - b. More discussion as more information is brought forward by NLCERA departments involved.
  - b. OEM Needs?
    - i. Five year flood luncheon for first responders September 8, 2018
  - c. NLCERA Fire/EMS Agency updates
    - i. Needed Improvements?
      - 1. Training delivery needs for skill enhancements
