 - 2. WFPD Chief Green described how WFPD is tied in with Larimer County and PFA, and is well informed and positioned for EMS response. Much positive happening to educate and inform civic and governmental local leadership. Practicing social distancing in town and at fire stations. Fire stations are designated limited access by the public, with only operations personnel allowed. Limiting access to patients by fire crews to conserve PPE and limit exposure to possible COVID patients. Suspected COVID patients are handed off to UCHealth ambulance personnel upon their arrival. No needs at this time.
 - 3. <u>LFPD</u> Joel Funk expressed gratitude to Jim Herrington, Mary Makris and Donn Maynard for their leadership and help to coordinate readiness for COVID-19 response at LFPD. Joel described difficulties with establishing new procedures (LFPD COVID-19 response guidelines) without being able to practice as a department. LFPD is staying informed with lots of emails. LFPD has adequate PPE supplies, yet is concerned if they have enough due to the possibility of a second wave of COVID-19 Patients. Support from Larimer County EOC has been good. No needs at this time.
 - 4. PCFPD Hugh Collins thanked LFPD for sending out their COVID-19 related department procedures, as they were very helpful. PCFPD has PPE for two COVID-19 responses, and then will restock from GVFPD cache. PCFPD has staged for UCH to arrive on suspected COVID-19 calls. No needs at this time.
 - 5. <u>GVFPD</u> Warren Jones described GVFPD is in good shape for EMS response. The cache of COVID-19 related PPE is

established at GVFPD Station 1, and warren will ensure any department needing resupply from the cache will have it as soon as possible. Warren thanked Joel and Donn for Livermore's work on the response procedures. Warren described how the NLCERA mountain chiefs are meeting weekly (Wednesday evenings) via phone or zoom to coordinate and inform. Warren expressed his concern about EMS skills training and how to attract new members in our current social distancing culture. He addressed the EMT Hybrid course options currently being researched with AIMS. Front Range Community College is not a current option for the EMT Hybrid course. Apparently there may be an option with Thompson Valley EMS in the future for EMT training. GVFPD has suspended their Squad response due to low number of EMTs. The Evacuation Drill scheduled for June is cancelled, as Larimer County and North 40 Alliance are not in a position to provide support due to COVID-19 duties. No needs at this time.

- 6. <u>RFLFPD</u> Bobby Hill advised RFLFPD is well equipped with PPE. The challenges are many within the constantly changing COVID-19 information and recommendations. RFLFPD is treating all calls as COVID-19 and putting masks on all patients. No needs at this time.
- 7. <u>CLFPD</u> Mark Rode advised they have three EMTs and that much of their response is tied to RFLFPD same update. CLFPD has adequate PPE at this time. Mark expressed concern and interest in having data available to indicate if COVID-19 is coming to the mountain communities. Training is also an issue due to social distancing, and how do we solve the training need problem? Mark would like to see weekly data sent regarding COVID-19 known locations. No other needs.

c. NLCERA EMS Contract Extension Update

- i. Kevin gave an overview of the EMS Contract extension status. Due to the complexity and time it was taking to incorporate amendments into the current contract, and with COVID-19 happening and taking 100% of staff energy, the current contract will be extended without any changes. The only changes will be with dispatch due to being based on call volume. The PFA Board approved this updated extension plan at the January 2020 Board meeting. When PFA is no longer under emergency declaration, the EMS Contract amendments previously being considered will be reassessed for possible inclusion. The NLCERA EMS Contract extension is for 12 months from June 1, 2020 to May 31, 2021.
- d. EMS Contract compliance measures during emergency declaration
 - i. Qualifies for Unusual Factors exemption requests due to COVID-19 specific variables.

- 1. Bill described that under declarations of emergency our EMS Compliance focus is on COVID-19 response data. All responses can be considered for qualifying for exemption due to extended decontamination and other considerations.
- ii. EMS response compliance measures are the same as normal, in addition to daily COVID-19 specific data measures.
 - 1. Aaron and Bill are meeting weekly and assessing the data in the same ways, including COVID-19. Monthly EMS Compliance meetings are suspended during the emergency declaration. All contract required reporting is happening on time.
- iii. COVID-19 Specific PPE Cache at GVFPD Station 1for NLCERA Rural Departments
 - 1. A cache of 36 sets of COVID-19 specific PPE is in place at GVFPD Station 1. Contact Chief Jones to coordinate needs.
 - 2. Each NLCERA BLS ambulance was issued a viral filter which should be replaced by the UCH ambulance on the call.
- e. NLCERA EMS First Responder Exposures update
 - i. PFA sent out a First Responder Exposures update to the NLCERA departments. This update was to assist the Infectious Disease Officers of each AHJ as they administer potential exposures to infectious diseases by their responders.
 - ii. No questions or discussion was requested at this meeting.
- f. NLCERA EMS BLS transports reimbursements update
 - i. Aaron provided an overview of what is happening at UCH to improve the BLS ambulance transport reimbursements. In the near future a new form will be placed at the NLCERA.org website for use. If there are any issues, please use the NLCERA.org Operational Form.
- g. NLCERA EMS Rural Peer Support: First Responder Peer Support resources available during COVID-19 (Fear and anxiety can be a challenge at this time within first response).

 - iv. Discussion about how difficult responding can be due to fear and anxiety for all our people. Ed and Joanne Rupert have made these links to services available to assist as needed. All were encouraged to refer anyone needing help to go to these links for resources.
 - v. Warren described he is working on a big-picture effort to enhance peer support in the future as a sustainable resource.
- h. NLCERA EMS Rural Departments: Any changes in leadership, roles or governance relating to EMS?
 - i. LFPD will have Donn Maynard back within two weeks from his winter travels to assume his Chief role.
- i. ReadyOp An email and text test to be sent on April 16, at 12:00.
